Water , Water , Everywhere

TEN YEARS' RAINFALL IN WAIMATE.

AN INTERESTING RECORD.

JANUARY THE WETTEST MONTH

Interesting comparisons may be made in the record of the rainfall in Waimate for the past ten years, which has been supplied to us by Mr T. S. Medicott, South Road. The record shows that the total rainfall for that period was 229.11, which shows an annual average rainfall of nearly 23 inches. Contrary to what might be expected, it is clearly shown that January is easily the wettest month of the year, the winter months showing much less rain.

Past happenings in Waimate

MAY

1865, 11th: Mr Woollcombe appointed Magistrate for Waimate, holding first court a month later. [*The Book of Waimate: Jubilee year 1879-1929*]

1866: Refusal of Government grant supplies to Waimate Road Board for bridges or culverts in the Waimate district. [*Lyttleton Times, 5 March 1866, pg 1*]

1870, 16th: Return of Agricultural Statistics for Waimate for 62 holdings. [AJHR]

Land broken not cropped 2,225 acres, under crop 3,744

Cropped Wheat: 922¾ acres 29,183 bushels

Cropped Oats: 113 acres for feed 873 for grain 30,370 bushels

Cropped Barley: 69 acres 1,750 bushels

Cropped Grasses: 58½ acres 66 tons hay, 1,450½ permanent

Cropped Potatoes: 40¾ acres 284 tons

Cropped Other: 275 acres

1877, 19th: Railway opened to Waimate. [*The Book of Waimate: Jubilee year 1879-1929*]

JUNE

1865 Naturalisation of some German settlers residing in Waimate held at Timaru Court, included Morris ARSHT, Friedrich. BRINKMAN, bushman;

Hermann MEYER, Carpenter; Elbert ABBENDSETH, bushman and Fritz Johan WERGER, bushman. [*Lyttleton Times, 30 March 1865, pg 5*]

1882, 10th The New Zealand Exhibition is officially opened at Christchurch. Privately funded, a 14-week show drawing 225,000 visitors. People from Waimate took the train to attend during the week-long exhibition

1872, 20th Board of Education: Included in the list of scholars to whom prizes have been awarded for good conduct and diligence was Minnie BOWLES, Waimate school.

1911, 24 The Rotunda in Seddon Square in memory of King Edward was officially opened under trying weather of southerlies and rain. The Brass Band played under the baton of Mr W J Wills. [*The Waimate Advertiser*]

JULY

1901, 16th FIRE IN WAIMATE. The Waimate Hotel and four shops, an old landmark – GONE. At 5.55am the fire-bell rang waking all from their beds to witness a fire of the Waimate Hotel with the adjoining shops. A stream of water continued on the windows and verandah of Manchester Bros stone store across the road. There were willing helper trying to remove stock from the shops Stationer – Messrs Franklin, Butchers – Meyers and Jones, Bootmaker – J Williams and Tobacconist - A Inkster. [*Waimate Advertiser*]
